My name is Erin Owens, and I am a Professor in the Newton Gresham Library at Sam Houston State University (SHSU). Participants will have the option to enter a prize drawing; three winners will be selected by random drawing, and each winner may choose from the following SHSU branded gear: sweatshirt in preferred size, pajama pants in preferred size, or pair of glassware in preferred style (exact items may vary based on availability on the SHSU Barnes & Noble bookstore website). Prize drawing entry is not required, and personal information from entries will be stored separately and will be impossible to connect to an individual survey response.



Your survey responses will be kept confidential to the extent of the technology being used. Qualtrics collects IP addresses for respondents to surveys they host; however, the ability to connect your survey responses to your IP address has been disabled for this survey.
