My name is Erin Owens, and I am an Associate Professor in the Newton Gresham Library at Sam Houston State University (SHSU). I am conducting a study to explore confidence and impostor phenomenon among scholarly communication librarians. I am asking academic librarians in the U.S. who support scholarly communication efforts at their institutions to complete a survey, with the option to enter a drawing for a \$25 Amazon gift card. The results of the survey are expected to be communicated via publication in a scholarly journal.

The following survey includes questions that ask you to rate your experience with impostor phenomenon and your confidence in your professional knowledge pertaining to scholarly communication. The survey also includes demographic questions, such as your years of experience with scholarly communication, years of experience in libraries, and your institution's Carnegie Classification. It will take about 15-20 minutes of your time to complete the survey. To qualify for this study, you must be over the age of 18 and employed in an academic library at a college or university within the United States.

Your participation in this study is voluntary. If you decide to

participate, your responses will be anonymous, recorded without any identifying information that is linked to you (not even your computer's IP address will be recorded). Because reflecting on feelings of impostorism may make some people uncomfortable, you are encouraged to complete the survey in a private environment, finish the survey in one setting, and clear your browser's cache after the survey is completed, in order to maintain the privacy of your answers.

This survey will be open from February 12, 2020, to March 12, 2020. **Deadline extended to March 31, 2020**.
